Regarding: COVID-19 and Statutes of Limitation

A few minutes ago Governor Lamont issued the attached Executive Order concerning suspension of statutory time limitations and other timing requirements related to civil cases. This Order is broad and was the result of much work within the Judicial Branch, as well as an open line of communication between the Governor's legal team and the Judicial Branch. We have been assured this line of communication will remain open and productive as the crisis evolves.

In addition, the Judicial Branch today issued the attached Notice that all Supreme and Appellate Court briefing deadlines in all cases are extended by 30 days.

As you might expect, Judge Carroll and other leaders within the Judicial Branch have been working around the clock under extraordinary pressure to address the numerous criminal, family and civil justice issues raised by the current COVID-19 crisis. The Governor's office has been open and receptive to ideas to address these issues, as is evidenced by the Executive Order. Because the Judicial Branch and the Governor's Office are inundated right now, please direct any questions about this Order to CTLA, rather than the Branch or Governor's Office. We will tabulate and communicate any questions to pass along in an orderly way so the Judiciary and Executive Branches can function as efficiently as possible.

I have been and plan to continue working closely with leaders from the Connecticut Bar Association, Connecticut Bar Foundation and other organizations to continue addressing other critical issues that impact civil practice. We will continue to keep you informed of other significant developments.

In the meantime, we hope you and your loved ones remain safe and healthy.
